

EMERGENCY SHELTER

The program provides:

- Shelter open 24 hours per day, Monday through Saturday, and 16 hours per day on Sunday
- Three meals a day (available to those living in the community, as well as shelter guests)
- Shower & laundry facilities
- Personal hygiene items

Staff provides:

- Assessment services and case management to address the problems that caused homelessness.
- Referrals to a variety of external professional resources as appropriate to address mental health, substance abuse, health or other issues.

CENTER FOR TRANSITIONAL LIVING

The program provides:

- Individual rooms 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- Space for families to stay together and increased supportive services to address the unique problems that individuals face

Staff provides:

- A more specialized case management plan to meet the needs of individuals or families with the goal of the guest attaining permanent independence

WOMEN & CHILDREN'S DAY CENTER

The program provides:

- Separate enhanced space for women & children to help them focus on and more effectively achieve their goals
- Indoor and secure outdoor play and recreational space
- Additional bathroom facilities, including showers and a bath tub for children

Staff provides:

- More individualized attention and support
- Classes offered specific to women's issues

OUTREACH PROGRAM

The program provides:

- One-time rent, mortgage and utility assistance to those who qualify to help them maintain their housing
- Ongoing rental subsidy to qualifying households

Staff provides:

- Personal budget assistance for program participants
- Referrals to other community resources
- Case management, if desired

Lazarus House is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit Emergency Shelter and Center for Transitional Living. We provide hospitality, food, safe shelter, and support services to men, women, and children who are homeless or in need.

Lazarus House is so much more than a shelter. Lazarus House is where people receive a hand up, not a hand out.



How We Help Our Guests

All Lazarus House Guests have the option of:

- Case management and advocacy
- GED & educational tutoring
- Credit counseling
- Life skills classes on topics such as financial management, job readiness, successful goal planning, parenting
- Trips to the community clothes closet
- Health care provided through a cooperative effort on the part of doctors, dentists, Tri City Health Partnership, and local funding assistance
- Haircuts
- Employment services
- Voter registration
- Monitored computer lab sessions
- Rental assistance
- Optional Bible studies and Sunday worship service.

We partner with other agencies, a large and wonderful network of volunteers, Federal, State and community resources, and our donors to provide the services needed by each person and family.

Our goals are to:

- Help homeless persons return to independent living with the skills and habits needed for long-term success
- Offer services and referrals to help those in need in our community in order to prevent homelessness and support the well being of individuals and their families.

Our desire is to give all those coming to our doors the opportunity for hope and a future.

How We Help Our Community

Lazarus House provides confidential services to people in our community.

Do you have a family member, friend or co-worker:

- **Who is late in paying rent or utilities?** We, and several other community agencies, may be able to provide persons in need support for rent and utilities through limited state and private funds.

- **Who can't work due to medical, mental health or other issues?** We can discuss possible benefits to which they may be entitled and refer them to other support services.

To help those in need, whether housed or homeless, we work with about 50 social service agencies in the area. We can refer people to resources for employment, food pantries, low income housing, available federal and state benefits, medical care for those without

benefits and counseling and other resources for those with mental health or substance abuse concerns.
